### About Cleburne Surgical Center

Opened in September 2007, Cleburne Surgical Center is an 8,000 square foot state-of-the-art facility. It is specifically designed for outpatient procedures with well-equipped operating rooms, a spacious procedure room, and several pre-operative and post-operative bays.

The patient-friendly design of the center ensures optimum flow and maximum privacy. As a multi-specialty facility, CSC provides same-day surgeries at a reasonable cost with savings to patients and payors. Outpatient surgery requires less time, allowing patients to return to their families and work schedules faster. CSC is a safe, reliable, and comparable alternative to a hospital with the added benefits of convenient parking, expedited registration, and a dedicated staff of knowledgeable healthcare professionals. Patients and physicians experience all of this in an environment designed for efficiency, comfort, safety, and privacy.

### Services and Procedures

Cleburne Surgical Center is fully equipped with state-of-the-art technology to perform outpatient surgical procedures in the following specialties:

Future enhancements including new technology and equipment or the addition of specialties may expand procedures offered at CSC.

The instructions below are provided to patients as general guidelines. Your physician may also provide instructions specific to the procedure being performed. Contact the center with any questions.

## Before Surgery

- Notify your surgeon before coming to the center if there is any change in your physical condition, such as a cold, fever, or a wound near your surgery site.
- Your doctor will advise you of any tests that may need to be performed by your primary care physician prior to surgery.
- A member of the surgical center staff will call you a few days prior to your surgery to obtain health and registration information and answer any questions you may have.
- If you are undergoing anesthesia, do not eat or drink anything after midnight on the day of your surgery. This will help reduce the chance of nausea or vomiting following anesthesia. Avoid the use of mints, chewing gum, or cigarettes. Failure to strictly adhere to these instructions may result in cancellation or delay of your surgery.
- If you are undergoing monitored anesthesia, do not eat anything after midnight on the day of surgery. You may drink clear liquids (water, apple juice or black coffee without cream or milk) up to four hours prior to your arrival at the center.
- Unless instructed by your physician, do not take any medication after midnight the day of your surgery. Please note: If you are on blood pressure or heart medication, or if you are a diabetic, obtain specific instructions from your physician.

## Day of Surgery

- It is your responsibility to make advance arrangements for a responsible adult to drive you home and remain with you for the first 24 hours after surgery. You may not drive yourself, be left alone, or leave the facility in public transportation unless accompanied by an adult. Failure to meet these guidelines could result in the cancellation of your procedure.
- Arrive 1 hour before scheduled time of surgery unless otherwise instructed.
- Please bring your insurance card with you.
- Do not apply cosmetics such as eye shadow or nail polish.
- If you wear contact lenses or glasses, bring a case for their safe keeping. We provide containers for removable dentures and bridgework.
- Please shower or bathe prior to your surgery.
- Wear casual and comfortable clothing and shoes. Wear something that is easy to change and will allow for bandages following surgery.
- You will be provided with a patient gown.
- Leave jewelry and other valuables at home.
- Please bring a list of prescription medications you are currently taking.
- Please be aware you will be required to sign a consent form for your surgery.
- Your family may wait in our lobby and rejoin you upon discharge.

## After Surgery

- It is your responsibility to make advance arrangements for a responsible adult to drive you home and remain with you for the first 24 hours after surgery. You may not drive yourself, be left alone, or leave the facility in public transportation unless accompanied by an adult.
- You will receive written instructions for your care that may include activity, medication, diet and rest.
- Plan to be in a recovery area for 1 to 2 hours following surgery.
- A nurse will contact you to check your status.
- Do not drive, smoke, drink alcoholic beverages or operate machinery for 24 hours following surgery.
- Contact your physician if you have any questions or problems.

## Insurance and Charges

Our business office will contact you regarding your insurance coverage and expected charges. Generally, all insurance carriers, including Medicare, reimburse outpatient centers just as they would other health facilities.

Standard charges have been established for all procedures performed at Cleburne Surgical Center. Your financial responsibility at the time of service will be any deductible and/or co-insurance. You will be balance billed for any services and/or charges not covered by your insurance plan. As a courtesy to you, we will bill your insurance.

Not included are fees for your physician and anesthesia services, laboratory fees, pathology, or other tests which may be ordered by your physician. Those fees are submitted separately.

Charges for cases not fully covered by insurance must be paid in full at the time of the service. The Cleburne Surgical Center will assist you in filing insurance claims. We will accept a personal check and certain credit cards, including Visa, Master Card, Discover, and American Express.

Cleburne Surgical Center has met State and Federal licensing standards to qualify for Medicare certification. Our center is accredited by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care and is a member of FASA.



### DIRECTIONS:

**From Ft. Worth** - Exit South I-35 onto Hwy 174 (Burlison/Cleburne)  
Turn Right on US-67 (Toward Glen Rose) for 2 miles.  
Turn Right onto FM 4. Center is at the corner of US-67 and FM-4

**From Glen Rose** - Follow Hwy 67 to Cleburne  
At the hospital, veer Left onto US-67 for approx. 1.5 miles  
Exit Right onto FM 4. Center is at the corner of US-67 and FM-4
